



Kent Netball Management Committee Role Profile

OFFICIATING LEAD

Introduction

The following role profile is not intended to be comprehensive, nor is it an expectation that potential volunteers will possess all the skills/personal qualities listed. However, as a Chair of a Kent Netball Subcommittee, the Officiating Lead will require some leadership experience.

The role of Kent Netball Officiating Lead is held by the elected official for two years.

This role profile should be read in conjunction with the Kent Netball Management Committee - Roles, Skills and Personal Qualities document which outlines the requirements of all KNMC officers.

The Officiating Lead's role is to:

- report to the Chairperson;
- be responsible providing management, leadership and taking a strategic overview of officiating;
- be responsible for improving standards of officiating within KN by providing opportunity for the continuous updating of knowledge and skill.
- identify and drive the training, development of mentors, assessors, umpires and table officials for KN;
- allocate umpires for the Kent County Senior League matches;
- oversee the work of the Officiating Coordinator;
- liaise between EN, Region, Registered Member Leagues, Subcommittees and the KNMC;
- guide, coordinate, and chair meetings of the Officiating Subcommittee;
- prepare a report of the year's activities for the AGM;
- represent KN at the L&SE Officiating TSG; and
- champion the Officials Award.

Skills/Personal Qualities of the Officiating Lead:

Chairs of the Subcommittees are required to have good communication, interpersonal and leadership skills. This role will suit someone with initiative and drive who is able to work in partnership with others, is good at teambuilding and has the ability to delegate.

An aspiring Chair of a Subcommittee will need to be willing to chair meetings and ensure that decisions are taken and followed-up. They will need to be a strong networker with some knowledge of KN's key networks and be prepared to speak clearly and succinctly as the public face of KN.

The Officiating Lead will ideally be a B Award Umpire (or above) and have sound knowledge of the EN officiating pathway.
