Club Competition >>>

This year's L&SE Regional League, was won by Essex Met based club Academy. Wealden, last year's winners, had another successful season taking the runners up spot. Also in Division 1 Vibrant had their best season for a couple of years finishing well in 4th place. In Division 2, Crystal Palace took the runners up spot behind Poly NC, a great achievement in their first year in the league. At the other end of the table Raiders finished in 8th place and will be re-joining the Kent County Senior League next season.

After promotion last season Telstars faced a tough season in Premier 2. But with 8 wins and only 3 points separating them from Grangetown in 4th, they finished in a credible 6th position. KCNC found it hard going however and with 3 wins finished in

10th place. This meant an automatic relegation to Premier 3.

In Premier 3 Comets also struggled with inconsistent results and finished the season in 8th place. With Lawn NC already relegated this meant Comets, and 9th placed Wyvern Grangers joined the Regional League winners to fight for the remaining Premier League places in the Play-offs.

The Premier League Play-offs took place over a weekend in May. L&SE winners Academy already had a squad in the Premier league, so the L&SE spot was passed to runners up Wealden. It was Wealden's second year in the Play-offs but after finishing 3rd in their group they were unfortunately out of the running early on. Comets meanwhile looked to be progressing to the latter stages, but a last minute



opposition fight back in their last game resulted in a draw and Comets also finishing 3rd in their group on goal average. Comets will now join Wealden in Division 1 of the Regional League

National U14 Clubs

Back to Netball








As Back to Netball continues to thrive across the county, Kent's second Back to Netball Festival took place in July at the Rainham Netball Centre.

With mixed results going into the weekend it was always going to be a big ask, but after some competitive matches the squad finished in a credible 4th place. This season England Netball have rebranded the NTL as the *Netball Performance League*. The NPL will provide the best possible competitive opportunity for the country's best young athletes and complements EN's performance pathways.

The NPL has 10 teams covering all 9 English regions, supplemented by the inclusion of the Junior Dragons from Cardiff. The 2013 / 14 NPL season begins with the annual pre-season tournament in November, and concludes in April. Trials for NPL squads have been taking place over the last couple of months and we are delighted to announce the following selections of Kent athletes:

In the U19 section Sevenoaks narrowly missed out on a National qualifying spot by finishing in an impressive 3rd place. Benenden found the going a little tougher and finished the day in 6th place.

In the U16 section however, great netball by the squad from TWGGS saw them go one better than last year and they took the U16 Regional title! This also meant National qualification for the 5th year in a row! Sevenoaks also had a great day, with plenty of great skills on display achieving an excellent 4th place finish.

Success was also seen in the U14 section. Tonbridge Grammar fought some tough matches taking the runners up spot behind Guildford High School and securing a National Finals place. Invicta, in their first Regional tournament, finished in 6th place.

Well done to all our Regional qualifiers!

At the **National Finals**, TWGGS got off to a flying start winning their first 7 seven matches and a semi-final spot looming! Unfortunately the unbeaten record didn't last as they lost their last game, but the team still won the group and progressed to the semi-finals. Once there they

faced tough opposition against Aldridge and, in an exciting game, qualified for the final by 1 goal! The final against
Beaconsfield was another fiercely contested match but this time TWGGS narrowly missed out on the title, losing by 1 goal.
TWGGS PE Teacher Kerry Murray said " It really was a truly brilliant final and all of the squad should be so incredibly proud of what they have achieved. They certainly showed they can compete at the highest level of netball and to be crowed second best in the country is an incredible accomplishment."

Well done to Kerry and the whole squad!!

Emerging Schools

The Emerging Schools Festival took place on 3rd July. Schools from across Kent brought their Year 7 & 8 netball teams to the festival, which aims to bring new young players into the game. All the schools taking part were "emerging" netball teams, in the early stages of their netball development, so the festival really was a grass roots event.

The Knole Academy had a great day winning both the Year7 & 8 competitions with Mascalls (Yr 7) and Blackfen (Yr 8) taking 2nd. Congratulations to all the winners, and thanks to all the schools for taking part.

School Games

The School Games is a new approach to competitive school sport designed to motivate and enthuse all young people. The games encompass a number of sports at intra school, inter school, county and national level.

The Netball finals of Kent's School Games were held at the Rainham Netball Centre on 27th June. 11 teams, all local festival winners, came together to find the Kent champions. After the group matches, the semi-finals provided exciting games, especially between Westcourt (Gravesham) and Claremont (Tunbridge Wells), with Westcourt winning the game by 2 goals. In the final, Westcourt played Ightham (Malling & Sevenoaks) who had so far remained

unbeaten. Great attacking play by Ightham saw them win the game by 2 goals and take the title. Fleetdown made up for their loss in the semi-finals by winning the bronze medal match against Claremont.

Games were superbly officiated by umpires from across Kent, and a team of excellent young leaders from Swadelands School helped the day run smoothly. Many thanks to both, and congratulations to all the schools who took part.



The London Games took place earlier in the year at Crystal Palace. All 33 London boroughs were represented by schools who had won their local competitions. Lewisham narrowly missed out on the semi finals and finished in 5th place. Greenwich finished in 17th, Bromley and Bexley in 21st. Well done to all our schools for taking part in the finals.

International Action

England took on South Africa in the FIAT International Series in September 2013. The three match contest took place in Bath, London and Worcester. The opening match occurred at the University of Bath on Sunday 22nd September. Anna Mayes' side started the Series strongly and ran out victors in the South West.



Three days later the action headed to London and Wembley Arena. England have a great record at the venues and secured the series with victory which continued our run of excellent results in front of a packed out area in the nation's capital.

A final stop off in Worchester brought the Series to a conclusion on Friday 27th September. Having enjoyed a fantastic Netball Superleague Grand Final in the West Midlands, its has been decided to take the last match back to the brand new University Arena. A 3-0 series success was cinched in front of a sell-our crowd in Worchester.

The National Team have now made their way to South Africa and we wish the squad huge success in all three games.
