The Kent Management Committee saw several new members join the team with Justine McAvoy taking on the role of Communications Secretary, Alex Carter joining us as a Committee Member and Emma Baker taking on the role of the Youth Representative. Caroline Duggan has also re-joined the committee initially as a committee member but kindly stepped in as the County Officiating Lead in December. I am pleased that they are all looking to remain in their positions for another year. After many years in the role of the Competition Secretary, David Roche has made the decision to step down. I would like to thank David for all his work over the years on the Kent Committee and for his attendance in Regional on behalf of Kent. Kent Netball is always looking for volunteers to come on board and I am pleased that we have two volunteers looking to join the team. The Netball Development Officer (NDO) is a paid post within England Netball and Phill Harvey, Kent's NDO made the decision to resign from England Netball in November. Phill have been a good asset to Kent Netball by being an effective conduit in advising us of the work that England Netball is doing and allowing us to balance the objectives of the County. However, when Phill left the post in November, it was not until Easter that the vacancy was advertised. Late June, Rachael Purchase was announced as Kent's new NDO.

This season, the Kent County Senior netball League returned without modified rules. Telstars Netball Club won the league and subsequently went to Regional play offs. They were successful and thus promoted to the Regional League division 2. Well done Telstars.

Kent Netball is always looking to encourage it's members to develop whether this is as a player, a coach or an official. According to England Netball's ENgage, Kent has 22 new Level 1 and 5 new Level 2 coaches. Congratulations to all those that achieved their coaching qualification this season.

Officiating has also seen much success with 70 learners passing their IO award, 31 learners passing their C award and 7 learners achieving their B award qualification. This is down to the commitment of the Kent mentors and assessors. Thank you all for your dedication in supporting our new officials.

I would also like to express my thanks to the Kent Leagues that offer umpire development and allow the County to assess on their matches.

Finally, I would like to acknowledge all the hard work that all the Netball volunteers do within the Kent County. Regardless of your role or how much time you are able to commit, it is the tireless work of the volunteers that makes netball in Kent so successful.
